Being safe and secure in your seat is the first thing to check and easiest to do.

New Zealand law and safety belts:

- Safety belts must be worn in the front and back seats
- If you sit in a seat fitted with a safety belt, you must wear it at all times
- As the driver, it's your responsibility to secure children under 16
